**Thank you Verna, Welcome Karen**

On behalf of all FOLL members, we want to thank **Verna Rowe** for her service as President of FOLL. Her expertise and leadership has demonstrated her dedication to the library in a myriad of ways. Verna will continue to support FOLL and participate as much as possible. On May 25, the FOLL Executive Board accepted Verna’s resignation with regrets, and pursuant to FOLL bylaws voted to appoint **Karen Jarrell** as President to fill Verna’s unexpired term. Karen has been an active participant in FOLL activities since joining in 2009.

**What is the Fate of the Lincoln Libraries?**

For the past several months, there has been much speculation and confusion regarding how the City’s budget crisis will affect the Carnegie and 12 Bridges Libraries, the library staff, services, programs, and hours of operation. **Lincolniters** have expressed their concern by attending and speaking at a number of events including a **Rally in front of City Hall, City Council meetings, and Budget Workshops**. Fundraising efforts to hopefully mitigate some of the costs for library programs such as **Mother Goose on the Loose** are on-going.

**So what else can YOU and WE do to keep our libraries open and functioning?**

**Attend the June 8 City Council Meeting** at McBean Park Pavilion at 6pm. This is the meeting where the budget will be discussed with the **final vote on the budget on June 22.**

At the April 20 workshop on the library budget, **Shirley Russell**, Vice President of FOLL, presented petitions signed by over 1300 residents collected in a three week period indicating their support for our two libraries. **YOUR** voice needs to be heard and **YOUR** presence felt at this important City Council meeting.
