**SPOTLIGHT ON FRIENDS MEMBER**

**Karen Jarrell, FOLL President**

(Editor's Note: we plan to "spotlight" a FOLL member or library supporter each newsletter starting with our new FOLL President.)

**Karen** began her work career in Fort Worth, TX as a legal assistant in a criminal law firm. She then moved to the Tarrant County Court where she reviewed probate and guardianship legal documents. She also worked in numerous local political campaigns.

**Karen** then moved to Washington, DC where she served on three US Senators' staff (**Ralph Yarborough, TX, Ted Kennedy's Health Subcommittee, and Thomas Eagleton, MO**). She then joined **President Carter's team** and moved to the West Wing of the White House as a member of Chief of Staff Hamilton Jordan's staff. Her office was right next door to the Roosevelt Room and around the corner from the Oval Office and the Cabinet Room.

After moving to California in late 1979, **Karen** eventually went to work for a paper products manufacturing and recycling company (**Smurfit-Stone Container Corp.**) as a lobbyist for state and federal affairs. Her last assignment was as National State Affairs Coordinator directing state lobbying efforts for the 32 states where the company had facilities. **Karen** retired after 26 years with SSCC in 2009.

**Lincoln became Karen's home in 2002** when she moved from Sacramento. She credits her love for reading to her Mother who faithfully took her to the library, and to the bookmobile in the summers, starting when she was very young. **She joined the Friends in 2009 and says she looks forward to the challenge of keeping our libraries open and viable for the Lincoln community.**

**THANK YOU, LINCOLN**

We will also forward monies collected for **Save our Library - Carnegie**. Other library programs are also being evaluated for support by the Friends.

Your support in our fundraising efforts allowed us to save the Carnegie and some library programs. All donations are appreciated. While we can't recognize those who donated by cash or to particular fundraisers, we do want to acknowledge and thank as many as we can. **If we have left anyone out or misspelled any names we sincerely apologize. Again, thank you Lincoln for your donations and help with keeping our libraries open.**

***MOTHER GOOSE ON THE LOOSE ON WHEELS***

Volunteer retired teachers **Barbara Mathot and Viola Kuka** are the “wheels” behind the **Mother Goose on the Loose on Wheels** program. These retired teachers take this program to the A.M. and P.M. Head Start Programs at Coppin School and the all day Head Start Program at First Street School. Approximately 72 children participated in the programs held once a month for 30-40 minutes each session during the 2009-2010 school year.

**Mother Goose on the Loose on Wheels** teachers place an emphasis on rhythm, rhyme, and motion during each session. The children are also shown the proper handling of a book, what the title page is, and the use of a book mark. There is also “fun” time by learning, and acting out, complete with props, nursery rhymes and stories. After the session, books are given to the children for their home library.

Teachers were also provided with a **Dr. Suess** books to read to their classes for the **Read Across America** national program in celebration of **Dr. Suess’** birthday. *The Hungry Caterpillar* book was given to each child as part of the national **Read for the Record** program. Additionally, a total of 600 books were distributed to the three classrooms in the 2009-2010 school year to support classroom library programs.

The Friends are happy to report that our “wheels,” **Barbara and Viola**, plan on continuing with this program during the 2010-2011 school year.

On June 22, the City Council passed the budget for the City and Library. **The Library budget was approved due to the support of the Save our Library Fund, Sutter Health, Friends of the Lincoln Library, Lincoln Moms and Kids Too, Friends of Lincoln Kids, Lincoln Community Foundation, Lincoln Lions, The Book Cellar, Green Tree Children's Ballet Company, Wardrobe, Ramos Oil Company, Italian Festival, Johnny Garlic Restaurant, and many other generous contributions.** The library will be able to continue offering most services and programs at both locations. Thanks to the Friends this includes our most popular program, *Mother Goose on the Loose*, which began again Thursday, July 8, 2010 at Twelve Bridges.

Unfortunately, even with donations, hours at the Carnegie location must be reduced. The remaining funds from the Save Our Library Campaign in the 1990s are part of the budget to keep this historic library open and serving the downtown area.

Starting, Friday July 2, 2010, Carnegie will no longer be open on Fridays. The Carnegie will continue to serve the community on Monday from 12 noon-5 pm and Wednesday from 11 am-5 pm.

Twelve Bridges hours remain the same, due to donations. Twelve Bridges is open Tuesday and Wednesday 1-7 pm, Thursday 10-5 pm and Friday and Saturday 1-5 pm.

Even with these cuts, the Library is available to the public five days a week for hopefully another year – something we really think is important.
